



If you need to register to vote, please review the following instructions:

1. You may register by mail up to 20 days before an election. If you are a first time voter in Wisconsin, and you register by mail, you must provide proof of residence.
2. You may register in the Town Clerk's office prior to 20 days before an election without providing proof of residence.
3. If you register in the Town Clerk's office between the 20th day before an election and the Friday before the election, proof of residence must be provided. The proof of residence must contain your name and current address.
4. Following is a list of acceptable proof of residence forms:
 - a. Current and valid Wisconsin driver's license or identification card.
 - b. Any other identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit
 - c. Any identification card issued by an employer and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not a business card.
 - d. A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election.
 - e. A gas, electric, or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing not earlier than 90 days before Election Day. Electronic statements may be used only if printed.
 - f. A bank statement. Electronic statements may be used only if printed.
 - g. A paycheck.
 - h. A check or other document issued by a unit of government

i. An affidavit on public or private social service agency letterhead identifying a homeless voter and describing the individual's residence for voting purposes.

j. A residential lease (cannot be used if registering by mail).
