

**TOWN OF OREGON, WISCONSIN
ORDINANCE NO. 90**

**AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE 2.1.2 OF CODE OF ORDINANCE
OF THE TOWN OF OREGON RELATING TO A
MUNICIPAL BOARD OF ABSENTEE CANVASSERS**

The Town Board of the Town of Oregon, Dane County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Title 2 Government and Administration of Chapter 1 General Provisions and Elections of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Oregon, relating to Municipal Board of Absentee Canvassers, is hereby created to read as follows:

Section 2.1.2 Municipal Board of Absentee Canvassers.

- a. The Board of Absentee Canvassers shall be composed of the Town Clerk or a qualified elector of the town designated by the Town and two other qualified electors of the town appointed by the Town for a term of two years commencing on January 1 of each odd-numbered year. The initial terms of the appointment shall expire on January 1, 2021, unless reappointed. All appointments shall comply with Wis. Stats. 7.52 and 7.53.
- b. The Board of Absentee Canvassers shall operate pursuant to the provisions of Wis. Stats. 7.52 and 7.53, as applicable.
- c. Pursuant to Wis. Stats. 7.52(1)(b), the Town may appoint additional inspectors to assist the Absentee Ballot Board of Canvassers in canvassing absentee ballots under this section.
- d. The Town Board in lieu of canvassing absentee ballots at polling places, hereby provides for the canvassing of absentee ballots by the Board of Absentee Ballot Canvassers, which shall canvass all absentee ballots at all elections held in the town pursuant to procedures established by the state division governing elections.
- e. The Town Clerk shall give at least 48 hours notice of any meeting of the Board of Absentee Canvassers under this section.
- f. The Town Clerk, not later than the closing hour of the polls, shall post at the Town Hall and the Town website, and shall make available to any person upon request, a statement of the number of absentee ballots that the Town Clerk has mailed or transmitted to electors and that have been returned by the closing hour on Election Day.


Section 3. If any section, clause, provision or portion of this ordinance is judged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in force and not be affected by such judgement.

Section 4. All resolutions, ordinance, orders or parts thereof in conflict in whole or in part with any of the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect upon passage and publication.


